



California: Children Entering and Exiting Foster Care














#### California: Children Exiting From Foster Care

Federal authority to pay IV-E for voluntary placements is in 42 USC 672 (a)(2)(A) and in (f) and (g). In California, a voluntary placement is considered voluntary Family Reunification (FR). A case plan is required and the parent is provided FR services in order to resolve the issue requiring placement in the 180-day period.


