Supreme Court Committee Seeks New Comments on Publication Proposal

Publication of Court of Appeal Opinions Would Be Encouraged Under Revised Proposal

San Francisco—The Supreme Court Advisory Committee on Rules for Publication of Court of Appeal Opinions is seeking public comments concerning a new revised proposed rule amendment that would encourage publication of appellate opinions that meet the criteria specified in related court rules.

The newly recommended revisions to Rule 976 of the California Rules of Court were drafted by the committee following consideration of comments to a proposal and report on the rule circulated for comment last year by the 13-member committee.

The revised recommendations would remove the presumption against publication of Court of Appeal opinions that do not meet the criteria for publication, and would insert language stating that opinions meeting the criteria should be published.

"The committee believes this newly proposed change will further encourage the publication of decisions that meet the stated criteria, thereby contributing to the development of the law and increasing public confidence in the appellate process," the committee states in its invitation to comment.

It added, "The committee also believes that the proposed change will not result in the publication of an overwhelming number of cases that are only marginally helpful to the bench and bar."

Chaired by Supreme Court Justice Kathryn M. Werdegar, the committee was appointed last year by the Supreme Court to determine whether the criteria or procedures for publication of Court of Appeal opinions should be modified.
