





Legal and biological are not the same thing!

Three ways to Become Legal Dad 1. Married when child is born,

- 2. Both sign Voluntary Declaration of Paternity (at birth or any other time),
- 3. Go to Court.


Deadline to Doubt...



- •Before baby turns 2 •Mom or dad may challenge paternity and ask the Court for DNA tests
- After baby turns 2 ·It's too late even if DNA tests show he is not the bio dad!

Before and After Court Teen parents have the SAME RIGHTS as any parent – even without a court order! BEFORE COURT Teen parents work together to make decisions. RISING CONFLICT!! CAN'T WORK TOGETHER!! Go to Court because there is a problem. Don't go just because.





LIGHTENING ROUND: TRUE OR FALSE.

- You can give up custody while you get yourself together – it's easy to get it back.
- When he picks up the baby for a visit, you have to send the baby with diapers and wipes.
- 3. If I get sole custody, I can deny him visits.
- 4. Moms have more rights than dads.
- 5. If he's not paying support, he doesn't have the right to visit
- 6. Moms never have to pay child support.
