	This rule prescribes when, in limited situations and in the interest of justice, a judicial officer may use remote technology to effectuate their own participation proceeding from a location other than a courtroom.								
	<u>(b)</u>	<b>Application</b>							
		<u>(1)</u>	This rule applies when a judicial officer presiding from a location other than a courtroom uses remote technology to effectuate their own participation in the proceeding.						
		<u>(2)</u>	This rule does not apply when a judicial officer presides in person over a proceeding convened in a location other than a court facility, even if another participant appears remotely.						
		<u>(3)</u>	This rule applies to all civil cases subject to Code of Civil Procedure section 367.75.						
		<u>(4)</u>	Nothing in this rule limits a judicial officer from engaging in any other judicial functions, duties, or actions authorized by law to be performed in a location other than a courtroom.
