Item 1

Tribal Child Custody Orders Proposal Revision

This proposal recommends that the Judicial Council approve two new forms and revise four existing forms to clarify that the requirement to recognize and enforce child custody orders under the provisions of the Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act (found in sections 3400–3465 of the Family Code) applies to custody orders issued by a tribal court. During comment period this proposal received nine supportive comments. There were several suggestions for minor clarifying revisions to the forms. The committee will consider these revisions, the draft comment chart, and Judicial Council report.

Item 2

Implementing Virtual Visitation on Domestic Violence and Family Law Forms

The committee will review and consider draft DV and FL forms to implement virtual visitation and consider whether the committee wants to: (1) approve the content of the DV and FL forms to take effect on January 1, 2025; or (2) seek public comment in a winter cycle proposal about how the DV and FL forms propose incorporating references to virtual visitation.

Item 3

Family Law: Child Custody Forms and Standard of Judicial Administration Under Senate Bill 599

The committee will consider the recommendation in the draft Judicial Council report to implement Senate Bill 599 by amending one standard of judicial administration relating to supervised visitation, approving a new information sheet to include the new statutory definition of virtual visitation, and revising three forms relating to child custody and visitation (parenting time) for cases involving allegations of a parent or parents' history of abuse or substance abuse under Family Code section 3011.
