Amnesty Purpose

- Provides relief to individuals with outstanding eligible debt
- Provides relief to individuals with suspended driving privileges

Amnesty Overview

Also helps to:

- Reduce amount of outstanding debt
- Resolve older cases (due prior to 2013)
- Provide a more realistic figure of statewide collectible debt

Amnesty Overview

- SB 85/Vehicle Code section 42008.8
- October 1, 2015 to March 31, 2017
- Reduction v. DL reinstatement
- Mandatory v. Optional

Civil Assessment

- Waived
- Not to be collected
- Cant be imposed for default
- VC 42008.8(d)

Civil Assessment


- If only civil assessment owed, outstanding balance will be zeroed out
- Civil assessment may be imposed, but not in amnesty context

Implementation

- Which entity is responsible for administering the program?
 - Court or county
 - Joint effort in many instances
 - Suggest written agreements for shared workload circumstances

Eligibility

- Vehicle Code and Non-Vehicle Code infractions
- FTA/FTP warrants (VC 42008.8 (g) (2))
- Excludes Parking/DUI/Reckless driving (VC 42008.8 (f))
- Specified Vehicle Code misdemeanor violations may be included (optional)

Amnesty Reduction Eligibility Criteria

- Citation filed with the court
- Initial due date for payment on or before January 1, 2013
- No restitution owed to a victim in the county
- No outstanding warrants in the county (fel/misd.)
- If on an installment payment or A/R plan, no payments made after June 24, 2015*

* Date subject to change

Other Considerations

- Violations with a mandatory court appearance may be ineligible
- Court appearances without a payment are eligible
- Amnesty participants are not eligible for Traffic Violator School (TVS)
- Community service in lieu of payment determined locally

Drivers License Hold Release

- Eligibility criteria less restrictive
- Drivers license hold is released for tickets that qualify for an amnesty reduction (VC 42008.8(e)(1))
- For tickets that do not qualify for a reduction, the hold is released for those in good standing in a comprehensive collection program (VC 42008.8(e)(2))

Drivers License Hold Release

- \$50 program fee may be assessed (VC 42008.8(1))
- Use existing processes for communicating w/ DMV on DL holds
- \$55 DL reinstatement fee handled by DMV; cant be added to new/existing payment plan

Program Costs

- \$50 amnesty program fee
- No other administrative fees permitted
- \$55 DMV DL reinstatement fee

Participation Form

- Sample participation form, may be customized locally

- Capture participant information, eligibility declarations
- Assist w/ program performance tracking

Payment Plans

- Payment plan an expected element of the program
- Ability to pay a key element (VC 42008.8(i) (2))
- May extend beyond March 31, 2017
- No administrative fees allowed*

*Admin Fees = initiation/set up/processing fees

Payment Processing

- 50% reduction on eligible violations
- 80% reduction with specified criteria:
 - Public assistance (GC 68632) DR
 - 125% federal poverty threshold
 - VC 42008.8(h) (2)

Default on Payment Plans

- VC 42008.8(i) (3)
- Program mails notice
- 30 days to respond
- May refer to FTB or other third party collections vendor

- Quarterly basis
- Mandatory components:
 - Number of Cases Resolved
 - Revenues Collected
 - Program Operating Costs

 - Tracking work on unresolved cases
 - Help support future discussions on workload impact
