38 **Rule 10.80. Administrative Director of the Courts (Administrative Director)**

39  
40 **(a) Functions**

41  
42 The Administrative Director ~~of the Courts~~, appointed by the Judicial Council under  
43 article VI, section 6 of the Constitution, performs those functions prescribed by the

1 Constitution and laws of the state, or delegated to the director by the Judicial  
2 Council or the Chief Justice.

3

7 **(b) Accountability**

8  
9 The Administrative Director is accountable to the council and the Chief Justice for  
10 the performance of the ~~Administrative Office of the Courts~~ Judicial Council staff.  
11 The Administrative Director's charge is to accomplish the council's goals and  
12 priorities.

20 In carrying out these duties, the Administrative Director is responsible for  
21 allocating the financial and other resources ~~of the Administrative Office of the~~  
22 ~~Courts~~ relating to the Judicial Council staff (including, for example, funding the  
23 operation of advisory bodies and other activities) to achieve the branch goals and  
24 policies adopted by the Judicial Council of California.

35 **(a) Establishment**

36  
37 The Administrative Director ~~of the Courts~~, under the supervision of the Chief  
38 Justice, employs, organizes, and directs a staff ~~agency, known as the~~  
39 ~~Administrative Office of the Courts~~ that assists the council and its chair in carrying  
40 out their duties under the Constitution and laws of the state.

2 **(b) Duties References to “Administrative Office of the Courts”**

3  
4 ~~The Administrative Office of the Courts assists the council and its chair in carrying~~  
5 ~~out their duties under the Constitution and laws of the state. The Judicial Council in~~  
6 ~~the past referred to its staff as the “Administrative Office of the Courts”. The~~  
7 ~~following applies where the term “Administrative Office of the Courts” is used:~~

9 **(1) Rules of Court**

10  
11 Throughout these rules of court and in all Judicial Council forms, all  
12 references to “Administrative Office of the Courts” or “AOC” are deemed to  
13 refer to the Judicial Council, the Administrative Director, or the Judicial  
14 Council staff, as appropriate.  
15

16 **(2) Other Judicial Council materials and actions**

17  
18 All references to “Administrative Office of the Courts” or “AOC” in any  
19 policy, procedure, manual, guideline, publication, or other material issued by  
20 the Judicial Council or its staff are deemed to refer to the Judicial Council,  
21 the Administrative Director, or the Judicial Council staff, as appropriate.  
22 Judicial Council staff will continue to be responsible for any active  
23 delegations or directives the Judicial Council made to the Administrative  
24 Office of the Court.  
25

26 **(3) Statutes**

27  
28 The Judicial Council, its staff, or the Administrative Director, as appropriate,  
29 will continue to perform all functions, duties, responsibilities, and other  
30 obligations imposed by statute or regulation on the Administrative Office of the  
31 Courts.  
32

33 **(4) Agreements and proceedings**

34  
35 The Judicial Council will continue to perform all duties, responsibilities,  
36 functions, or other obligations, and bear all liabilities, and exercise all rights,  
37 powers, authorities, benefits, and other privileges attributed to the  
38 “Administrative Office of the Courts” or “AOC” arising from contracts,  
39 memorandums of understanding, or other legal agreements, documents,  
40 proceedings, or transactions. The Judicial Council may be substituted for the  
41 “Administrative Office of the Courts” or “AOC” wherever necessary, with no  
42 prejudice to the substantive rights of any party.

6  
7 **Advisory Committee Comment**

8  
9 The Judicial Council in 1961 adopted a resolution that named its staff the “Administrative Office  
10 of the California Courts.” In 1970, the council adopted a rule of court that renamed its staff the  
11 “Administrative Office of the Courts.”

12  
13 In recent years, the council became aware of recurring confusion about the relationship between  
14 the Administrative Office of the Courts and the Judicial Council. There was a common  
15 misperception that the Administrative Office of the Courts was a separate entity from the council  
16 having independent policymaking authority, when in fact, the members of the Judicial Council set  
17 policy, and staff, by whatever name, support the work of the council under the members’  
18 direction and oversight. The confusion about the role of the Administrative Office of the Courts  
19 impeded the council’s ability to advance the interests of the judicial branch.

20  
21 To allow the council to better achieve its mission, it decided in 2014 to retire the name  
22 “Administrative Office of the Courts.” This adjustment underscored the unity of identity of the  
23 Judicial Council and its staff, and clarified that there has always been only a single entity. The  
24 retirement conformed the Judicial Council’s practice with that of other state government entities,  
25 which do not assign a separate name to their staffs.

26  
27 The 2014 amendments to this rule are intended to implement the retirement of the name  
28 “Administrative Office of the Courts” and clarify that in retiring the name no substantive legal  
29 change has occurred. The Judicial Council and its staff will continue to discharge any legal  
30 obligations and duties they may have, regardless of the discontinuance of the use of the name  
31 “Administrative Office of the Courts.”
