Dear Assembly Member Jones:

The Judicial Council is pleased to support AB 2618, which would make a number of conforming changes to statutes referencing the jurisdictional limit in small claims cases, including discrimination actions under Civil Code section 52.2, specified enforcement actions for declaratory, injunctive, or writ relief, or for relief in conjunction with a claim for monetary damages involving common interest developments pursuant to Civil Code section 1369.520, and actions regarding security deposit disputes pursuant to Civil Code section 1950.5. The bill would also make technical, conforming changes to a number of provisions in the Small Claims Act (Code of Civil Procedure sections 116.360(a), 116.390(a), 116.540(e) and 116.610(a)) and the Public Utilities Act (Public Utilities Code section 311.4(f)(1)), by adding cross-references in those statutes to the higher jurisdictional limit in Code of Civil Procedure section 116.221.

The Judicial Council supports these changes because they are consistent with the recent legislation that raised the jurisdiction of small claims court actions brought by natural persons from \$5,000 to \$7,500 (AB 1459 (Canciamilla), Stats.2005, ch. 618 and SB 422 (Simitian) Stats. 2005, ch. 600). We appreciate the author's agreement to include in the bill a number of conforming changes to the Small Claims Act and other codes that should have been made at the time AB 1459 and SB 422 were enacted. These changes will correct the drafting oversights from last year and provide greater access to the courts by allowing more actions to be brought through the much simpler and less expensive small claims court process.
