Dear Assembly Member Achadjian:

The Judicial Council is pleased to support AB 2195, which amends Welfare and Institutions Code section 256 to allow repeated truancy violations to be referred to the county juvenile traffic court and be heard by a hearing officer, at the discretion of the probation officer, instead of being referred to the juvenile court.

The council supports AB 2195 because it believes truancy issues are more appropriately handled in a less formal, decriminalized setting. By addressing these important cases in the more informal setting of the juvenile traffic court, courts and county probation departments gain expedited access to an early intervention program for children with school attendance problems, without the increased cost or time of a Welfare and Institutions Code §601 filing in the juvenile court, which can lead to a minor being adjudged a ward of the court. In counties where this option is available, the council believes that there will be a wide range of benefits realized, both for the individual minors in question and for the courts as a whole.

The Judicial Council is pleased to support AB 2195, which amends Welfare and Institutions Code section 256 to allow repeated truancy violations to be referred to the county juvenile traffic court and be heard by a hearing officer, at the discretion of the probation officer, instead of being referred to the juvenile court.
