Item 1

Juvenile Dependency: Proposed Allocation for Fiscal Year 2016-2017 for Court Appointed Special Advocate Local Assistance

Each year the Family and Juvenile Law Advisory Committee (“committee”) recommends to the Judicial Council allocations for Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) programs. This funding is allocated to county-based programs that have been designated by the superior court and that meet the criteria in rule 5.655 and the program standards of the National CASA Association. On the recommendation of this committee, the Judicial Council at its August 23, 2013 meeting adopted a new methodology for allocations with the intention of applying that methodology in fiscal year 2013-2014 and in subsequent years. Allocations are typically considered by the Judicial Council at the October meeting. At this meeting the committee will be providing background information and options for the committee to use in formulating recommendations for CASA grant funding in FY 2016-2017. Allocations will fund 45 programs serving 50 counties.
