Review and Discussion of Dual-Status Youth Data Standards Working Group (AB1911): Draft Legislative Report (Action Required)

The Legislature enacted Assembly Bill 1911 ([Eggman]; Stats. 2016, ch 637) that requires the Judicial Council to convene a prescribed group of stakeholders to define data

elements and outcome tracking for youth involved in the dependency and delinquency system and report to the legislature by January 1, 2018. In Fall 2016, members of this committee volunteered to participate in the Dual-Status Youth Data Standards Working Group along with justice partners as designated in AB 1911. The working group intends to submit a final report to this committee in September 2017. In advance of that submission, the working group wishes:

1. To provide this committee with the preliminary report, and
2. Receive questions, comments, or requests for clarification or changes from committee members and interested members of the public before the working group finalizes its report.
