Item 1

Access to Visitation Grant: Program Funding Allocation for Federal Grant Fiscal Years 2021–22 and 2023–24: The Family and Juvenile Law Advisory Committee approval of Access to Visitation Grant Program funding allocation and distribution of approximately

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\$655,000 to \$670,000 statewide for federal grant fiscal years 2021–22 through 2023–24. The Access to Visitation contract period begins on April 1 and ends on March 31 (of each of the three fiscal years). Subject to the availability of federal funds, the funding allocations will be directed to nine superior courts, representing 14 counties, to support and facilitate noncustodial parents' access to and visitation with their children through supervised visitation and exchange services, parent education, and group counseling services for family law cases. Family Code section 3204(b)(2) requires the Judicial Council to determine the final number and amount of grants to be awarded to the superior courts.
