The committee will review the minutes of January 6, 13, and 27, 2025, Family and Juvenile Law Advisory Committee meetings.

Item 1

Juvenile Law: Retention of Jurisdiction and Petitions Requesting Juvenile Case files of Deceased Children

The committee will review a revised proposal to implement [Assembly Bill 1756](#) (Stats. 2023, ch. 478, § 62), [Senate Bill 1161](#) (Stats. 2024, ch. 782, § 12), and to clarify the different legal standards for petitions seeking disclosure of a living child's juvenile case file under section 827(a)(1)(Q) and a deceased child's juvenile case file under section 827(a)(2), by adopting one rule of court, amending three rules of court, adopting six new forms, and revising six forms.

Item 2

Family Law: Summary Dissolution Forms (Revise forms FL-800 and FL-810)

The Family and Juvenile Law Advisory Committee will review a draft report with recommendation to revise two family law summary dissolution forms, which are mandated by Family Code section 2400, to reflect an increase in the California Consumer Price Index.

Note: The state figures that determine if the asset limits in the forms will change are published the first week in February. Until then, staff will not know if any changes will be needed.

Staff request permission from the committee to move forward with technical changes to forms FL-800 and FL-810 if the calculations require updating forms FL-800 and FL-810. A template of the report is submitted for review and discussion.

Item 3

Family Law: Technical Changes to Forms

(Revise forms FL-142, FL-145, FL-165, FL-300, FL-306, FL-312, FL-313-INFO, FL-314-INFO, FL-320, FL-320-INFO, FL-340, FL-341(B), FL-343, FL-411)

The Family and Juvenile Law Advisory Committee recommends technical changes to improve several forms by correcting clerical errors, updating references to state and federal codes, and making other minor changes to align the forms with statewide procedures. The technical changes will improve the accuracy of the forms and avoid causing confusion for court users, clerks, and judicial officers.
