Notice of Action by Email Between Meetings for Family and Juvenile Law Advisory Committee

The cochairs of the Family and Juvenile Law Advisory Committee having concluded that prompt action is needed, public notice is hereby given that the Family and Juvenile Law Advisory Committee proposes to act by email between meetings on September 1, 2026, in accordance with California Rules of Court, rule 10.75(o)(1)(B). PROPOSED ACTION

The Family and Juvenile Law Advisory Committee will vote by email on whether to approve the allocation of \$19.9 million in Court Appointed Special Advocate program grant funding, included in the Budget Act of 2026, to the California Court Appointed Special Advocate Association for fiscal year 2026–27. The funding supports local court-appointed special advocate programs that recruit and train volunteers appointed by judicial officers to provide advocacy for children under the jurisdiction of a juvenile court. The funding also supports the California Court Appointed Special Advocate Association’s initiatives for statewide volunteer recruitment, shared resources and infrastructure, and training.
