In 2014 the annual National Indigenous Legal Conference was combined with the World Indigenous Legal Conference in Brisbane Australia. The conference addressed: indigenous knowledge: practice and research; human rights; indigenous women and children; economic independence; relationships to land; and criminal justice. Indian Child Welfare Act Cases

• <u>In re Abbigail A., 226 Cal.App.4th 1450 (2014)</u> (rev. granted)

• <u>In re J.S. (4th Appellate District, issued 9/11/14 and modified so as not to be unpublished 9/25/14)</u>

Fourth District Court of Appeal, in an unpublished opinion, followed the Third District Court of Appeal case of Abbigail A, and held that the child did not fall within the Indian Child Welfare Act even though a great grandparent was an enrolled member and the tribe confirmed the child was eligible for membership.
