**Title:** Fiscal Year 2025–26 Reallocation of Community Assistance, Recovery, and Empowerment Act Funding

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### **Issue**

Consideration of a recommendation from the Trial Court Budget Advisory Committee (TCBAC) for a one-time reallocation of \$72,960 from unspent Community Assistance, Recovery, and Empowerment (CARE) Act funding in fiscal year (FY) 2025–26 to provide additional resources to one trial court—the Superior Court of El Dorado County—that exceeded their current year allocation to support program activities.

### **Background**

The Budget Act of 2025 included \$32.9 million to fund court operations related to the CARE Act in FY 2025–26 for the 58 trial courts.

At its business meeting on July 21, 2023<sup>1</sup>, the Judicial Council approved an allocation methodology that included the following:

1. For Cohort One courts implementing the CARE Act, an allocation for court hearing costs that employs the Workload Formula with a base of 25 CARE Act cases calculated at \$93,225;
2. For Cohort One courts implementing the CARE Act, an allocation for staff and other operational costs that employs the Workload Formula with a base of \$98,000, prorated to the amount that Cohort One courts are estimated to receive in FY 2024–25 when all courts are implementing the CARE Act;
3. For Cohort Two courts, an allocation that employs the Workload Formula with a base of \$98,000, prorated to the amount that remains after the allocation described in step two above and after reduction by 0.5 percent to hold as a reserve for Cohort One courts that require additional program funding, with any unspent funding from the court allocations

and this reserve redistributed through the reallocation process via the approved methodology; and

4. A method to reallocate unspent funds during the fiscal year.

### **Reallocation Survey and Process**

Judicial Council staff sent out the reallocation survey to the 58 trial courts in January 2026 to obtain an estimate of their potential unspent funding available in FY 2025–26 for the one-time reallocation process. A total of 53 courts responded to the survey.

There are 38 courts that indicated through the survey that they anticipate expenditures lower than their allocation, and are able to return CARE Act funding in FY 2025–26 through the mid-year reallocation process. The total amount of unspent funding estimated by the 38 courts is \$9.9 million.

There is one court that indicated they would be able to utilize additional CARE Act funding in FY 2025–26, the Superior Court of El Dorado County. The additional funding needed by the court is \$72,960.

The \$72,960 requested will be deducted from the allocations of those courts returning funding on a pro-rata basis. This leaves 99 percent of the \$9.9 million of the estimated unspent funding currently to continue to fund services through the end of the fiscal year. While courts currently project approximately \$9.9 million in funding available for return, actual expenditures may vary by the end of the fiscal year.

The list of courts and detailed survey results are outlined in Attachment A.

Upon approval of the recommendation, council staff will include the reallocation of \$72,960 in the May 2026 distribution to the trial courts.

### **Recommendation**

Approve the TCBAC recommendation to reallocate \$72,960 of unspent CARE Act funding in FY 2025–26 to the Superior Court of El Dorado County as outlined in Attachment A. This recommendation will be considered by the Judicial Council at its business meeting on April 24, 2026.
