History of the SAFG/DDC Grant

Substance Abuse Focus Grant

- Funded since FY 1998-99.
- \$1,160,000 budget
- Funds any collaborative court following the 11 key principles*
- Treatment and education
- Source of funds: State

Family Treatment/Dependency Drug Court Augmentation

- Funded since FY 2014-2015.
- \$75,000 budget
- Family Treatment court/Drug Dependency Court only
- Treatment-based only
- Source of funds: Federal

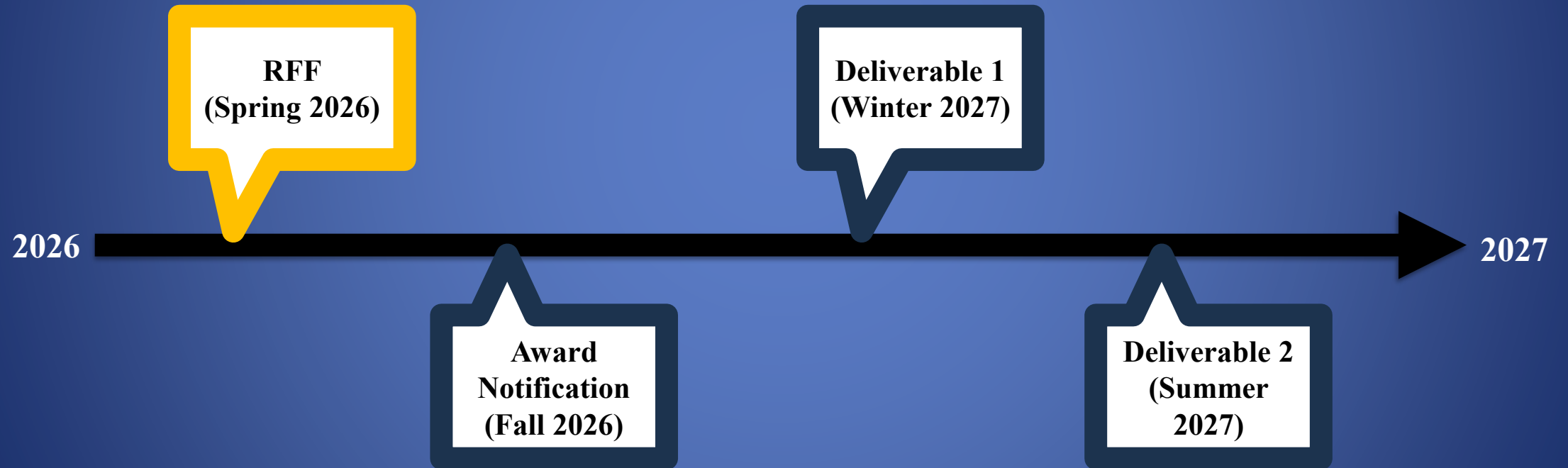
CJCAC's Role

- Issue of grant administration and policy


The Council must approve any allocations or changes to the grants.

How Courts Can Apply



Updated Methodology (revised 2023)

- Transitioned to a population-based award
- Population of 18-24 years old
 - This specific population was considered the most impacted by collaborative courts
- Courts can not receive less than 5% reduction compared to their previous award

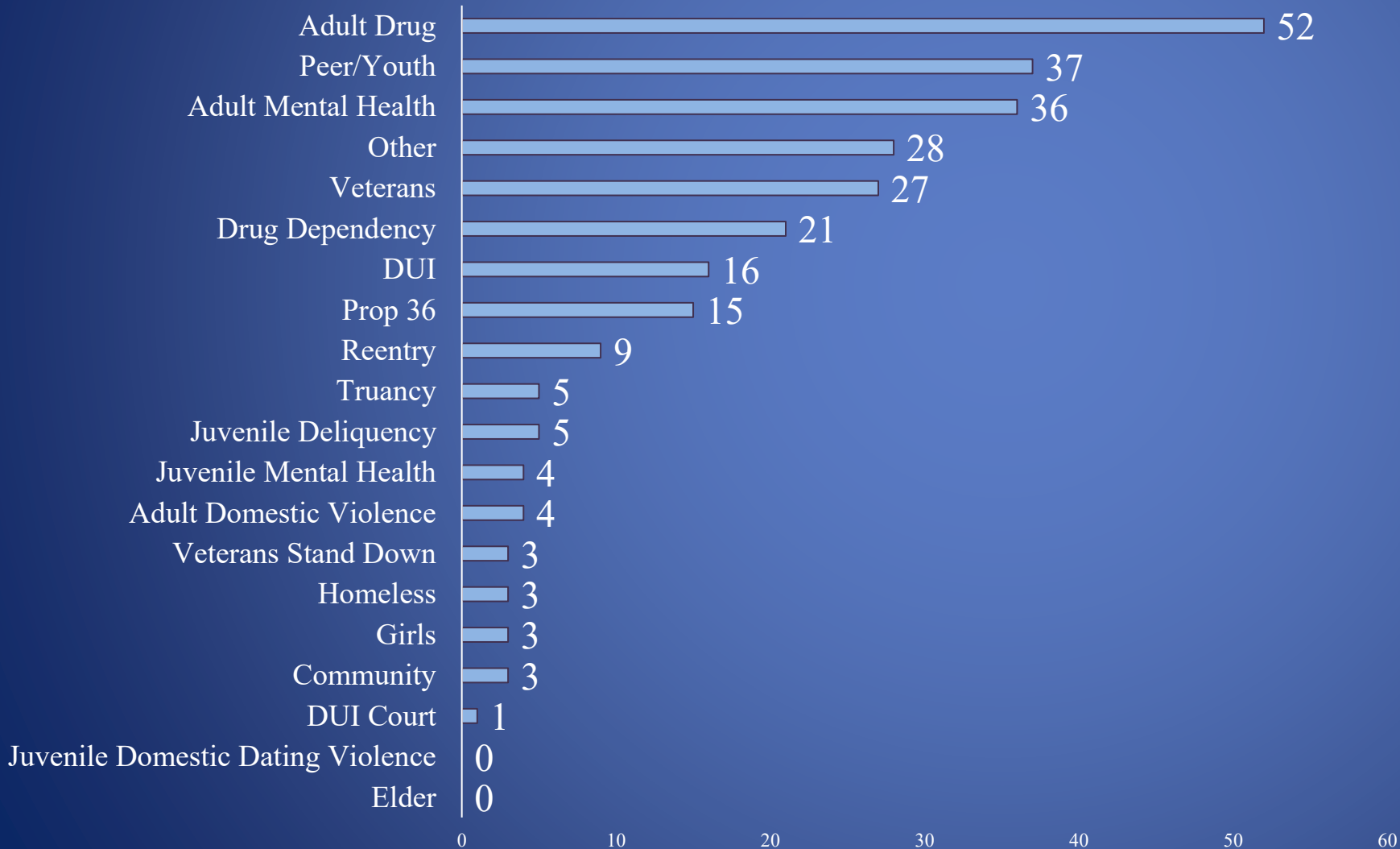

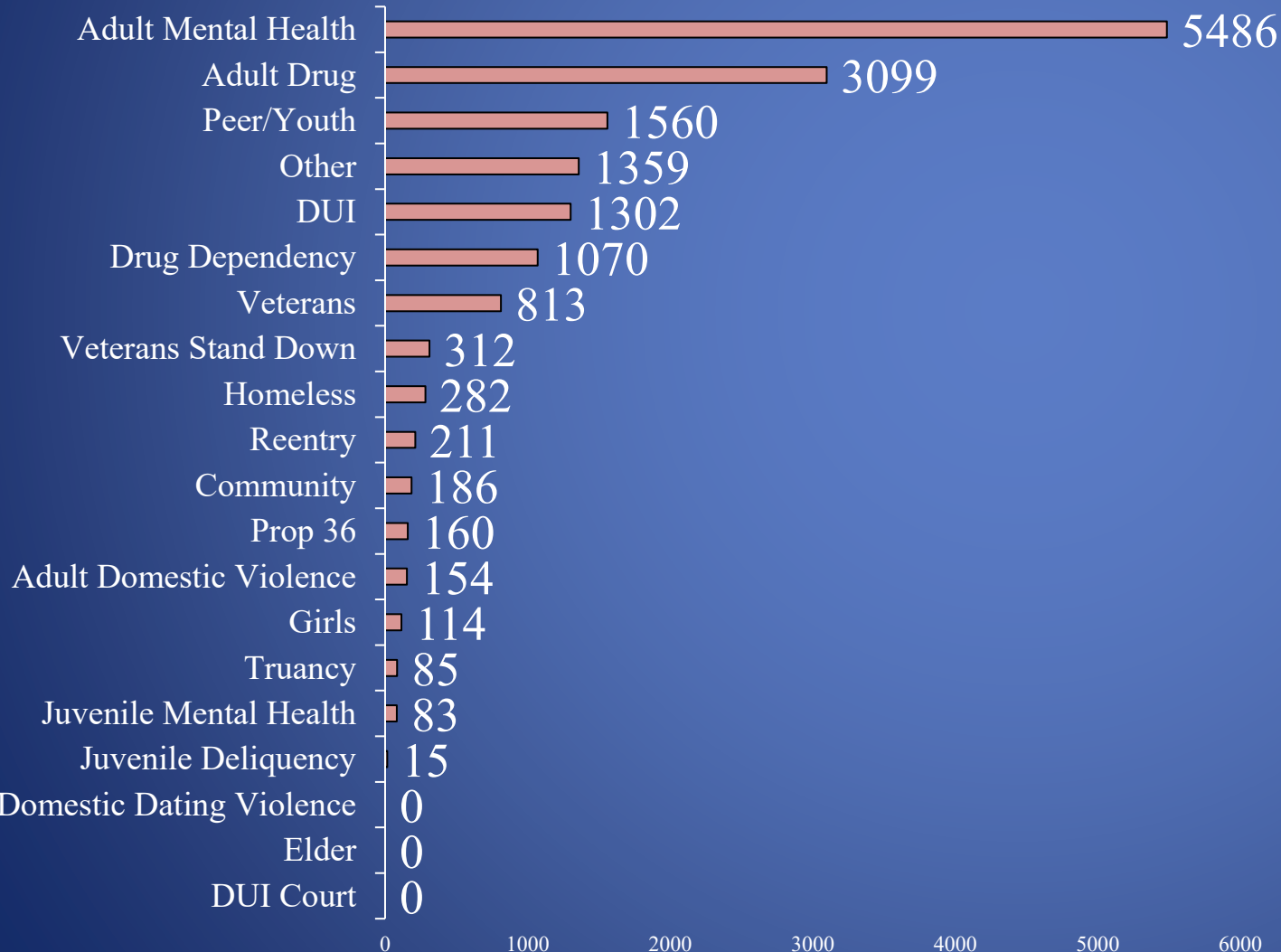

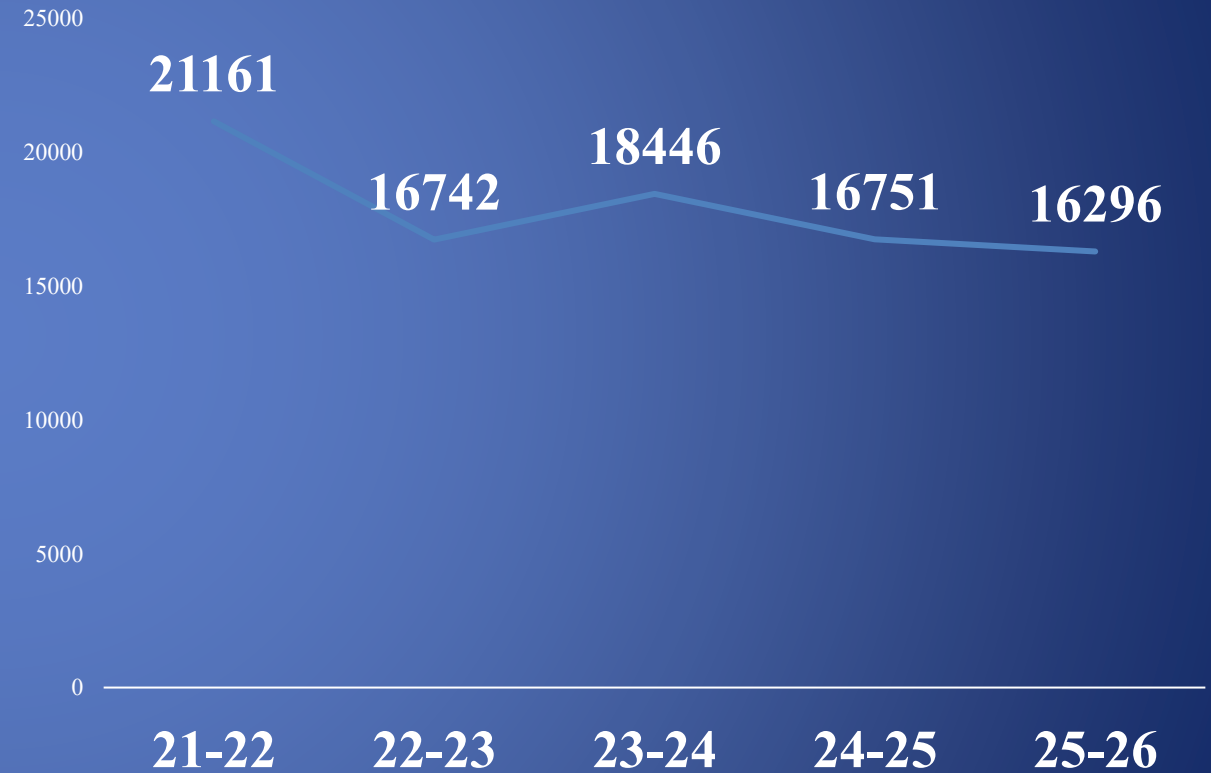
of Participants by SAFG-Funded Collaborative Court Type

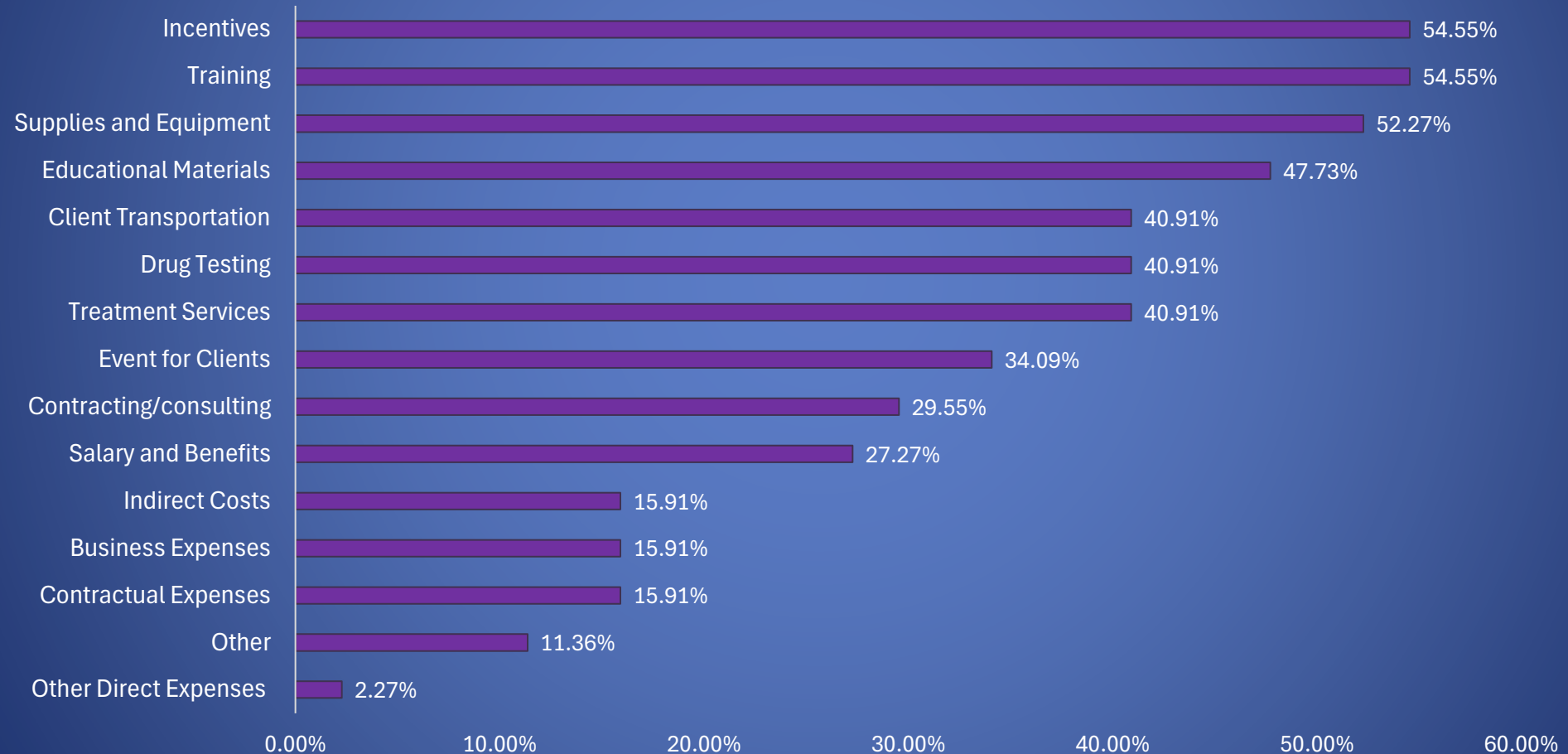

Courts funded and participants served across the past five years (FY 21-22 to 25-26)

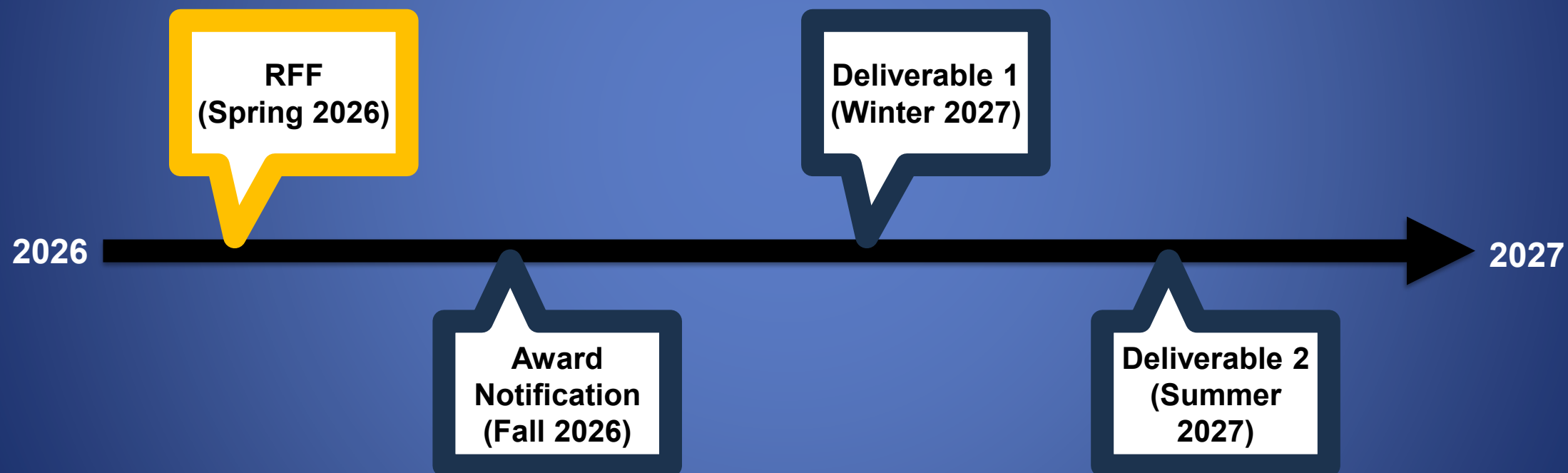


Use of SAFG Funds by the Courts
