OPEN MEETING

Call to Order and Roll Call

The meeting was called to order at 10:08 a.m. and roll was taken.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION ITEMS

Motion #1 – Encumbrance Report (Item 1)

Motion #2 - Guiding Principles for Deliberating Allocation Reductions

Action: A motion was made, seconded, and approved unanimously to adopt the same criteria and principles that were used at the subcommittee's March 10-11, 2015 meeting to help guide them in their decision-making process during their deliberations as follows:

- whether programs/projects are mandated
- the number of courts served
- value to the courts and the branch according to the survey results
- the appropriateness of the IMF as the fund source
- the impact program and project funding reductions would have on individual courts and the judicial branch.

Motion #5 - Recommendation #3 of Item 2 Related to TCTF Allocations for 2016-2017

Action: A motion was made, seconded, and approved unanimously to adopt the following:

• For the jury reimbursement program, direct JCC Finance staff to make, if eligible 2016–2017 jury costs exceed the total 2016-2017 allocation, a year-end allocation adjustment so that each court receives the same share of the approved allocation based on their share of the statewide allowable jury expenditures.

Other Actions Tentatively Approved

- Explore options for reducing the premiums for judges' participation in the Judicial Performance Defense Insurance program.
- Brian Taylor will work with the JCC Legal Services Office to review the IMF-funded programs that provide legal services for trial courts (Litigation Management Program, Regional Office Assistance Group, and the Trial Court Transactional Assistance Program).
- Request the JCC IT office to bring back updated options for reducing, if not eliminating, the cost spikes in the LANWAN program, including a leasing/financing option(s) and to address the projected future costs of the Statewide Policy/Planning Program, particularly in light of previous years' expenditure levels.

Item 2 Trial Court Trust Fund (Discussion Item)

The Trial Court Trust Fund (TCTF) fund condition statement provided in Attachment 2A reflects the initial allocation decisions made by the TCBAC Revenue and Expenditure Subcommittee on January 14, 2016 and the Governor's budget proposal. The initial allocations decisions related to the TCTF Judicial Council (0140010, formerly Program 30.05) and Trial Court Operations (0140019, formerly Program 35.15) appropriations are provided in Attachment 2B. The initial allocation decisions related to the TCTF Support for Operations of the Trial Courts (0150010, formerly Program 45.10) are provided in Attachment 2C. The Governor's budget proposal for 2016–2017 contains \$121.4 million in new funding related to the TCTF, as follows:

- Court Operations, \$20.0 million
- Employee Benefit Costs, \$15.6 million
- Employee Benefit Adjustment, \$8.3 million
- Proposition 47 Costs, \$21.4 million
- Court Security for Marshals, \$0.3 million
- Unforeseen Emergency Funding, \$10.0 million
- Revenue Backfill, \$8.8 million
- Language Access, \$7.0 million
- Court Innovations Grant Funding, \$30.0 million

All of the funding related to court operations, employee benefits, Proposition 47, and court security are assumed to be fully allocated by the council in 2016–2017, and therefore have a net zero impact on the 2016–2017 ending fund balance.

The \$10 million in unforeseen emergency funding is displayed in row 38 as restricted funding and assumes nothing is allocated in 2016–2017. If monies are allocated, courts would need to replenish the monies up to what was allocated by the council from their allocations in 2017–2018.

The additional revenue backfill of up to \$8.8 million supports courts' base allocation, and will occur only if revenue that supports courts' base allocations continues to decline in 2016–2017. The total up to \$75 million in revenue backfill has no impact on the TCTF fund balance.

The language access funding of \$7 million would augment the Court Interpreters (0150037, formerly Program 45.45) appropriation to provide additional funding for court interpreters in civil proceedings. The Department of Finance has posted the Budget Change Proposal from the Judicial Branch that requested additional new funding at the following URL:

The \$30 million in one-time funding for a Court Innovations Grant Program was appropriated to the TCTF Support for Operations of the Trial Courts appropriation. However, not all of the funding is intended to be awarded to trial courts. \$21.4 million is available for expenditure and/or encumbrance until June 30, 2018.

Item 3 State Trial Court Improvement and Modernization Fund (Action Item)

Initial Allocation Decisions

Attachment 3A displays the initial allocation decisions for 2016-2017 made by the subcommittee on December 14, 2015, specifically columns J and K. Column I provides updated allocation needs for 2016-2017. For ease of reference, column D provides one sentence program descriptions. Attachment 3A1 provides more expansive but still short program descriptions.

Updated IMF Fund Condition Statement

Attachment 3B, the IMF fund condition statement, provides the estimated ending fund balance for fiscal years 2015–16 through 2019–20 under three LAN/WAN scenarios/options (see Attachment 3D for a discussion of the scenarios/options). The updated fund condition statement displays three ending fund balance scenarios ranging from negative \$4.6 million to \$2.3 million in FY 2016-17. In all three scenarios, it is assumed that the Judicial Council will receive \$8.7 million in new General Fund monies so that \$8.7 million in Phoenix IMF costs for JC staff are shifted to the General Fund starting in FY 2016-17, the most current estimated allocation need (see Attachment 3B1), and that IMF funding for the V3 civil case management system is completely phased out in 2019-20. In addition, the attachment displays the change in fund balance if the initial decisions and the option related to reducing the allocation for legal service programs are adopted.

Allocation Options Related to Legal Services Office Programs

Attachment 3C provides a report from Brian Taylor and includes two allocation options.

LAN/WAN Scenarios/Options

In Attachment 3D, the JCC Information Technology office, working with court CIOs, has identified three scenarios for rolling out replacement network switches under the Telecommunications Support program. Scenario 1 does not defer the replacement of any network switches and the allocation need is \$28.8 million in FY 2016–17 and \$65.7 million for the four-year period from 2016–17 to 2019–20. Scenario 2 defers the replacement of 370 network switches to 2016-17, and the allocation need is \$22.5 million in 2016–17 and \$65.7 million for the four-year period. Scenario 3 replaces \$22.5 million in equipment on schedule and finances the remaining \$6.3 million in equipment and services. The FY 2016-17 allocation need for Scenario 3 is \$22.5 million and \$66.4 million for the four-year period from 2016-17 to 2019-20.

Trial Court Budget Advisory Committee, Subcommittee Report Legal Services Office/Legal Programs funded from IMF

Judicial Performance Defense Insurance (\$966,600)

The allocation for the Judicial Performance Defense Insurance program is used to pay the insurance premium for trial court judges and judicial officers for the Commission on Judicial Performance (CJP) defense master insurance policy. The program was approved by the council as a comprehensive loss-prevention program in 1999. The program is open to all justices, judges, commissioners, referees, and hearing officers. To obtain insurance coverage, judicial officers agree to complete an ethics training program once every three years. The program (1) covers defense costs in CJP proceedings related to CJP complaints; (2) protects judicial officers from exposure to excessive financial risk for acts committed within the scope of their judicial duties, and (3) lowers the risk of conduct that could lead to complaints through required ethics training for judicial officers.

Review of Program

The Legal Services Office has performed a thorough review of the program working with the insurance broker to determine whether or not changes can be made to the program to reduce the cost of the program. LSO looked at the option of reducing the cap on coverage, charging a deductible and whether or not the policy is available on the open market for judges to independently purchase.

- Reducing the cap on coverage would not reduce the premium. The majority of claims are
 resolved at the initial phase of the complaint, which is where the bulk of work is performed.
 Reducing the cap would reduce the value of the policy and have little to no impact on the
 premium.
- LSO examined the impact of a \$2,000 deductible for the program. Last year there were 94 claims, which would result in \$188,000 savings to the program. Almost 20% of the claims are against family law judicial officers. A deductible would have a disproportionate impact on this group. The insurance carrier, CNA, indicated they would not collect the deductible. It would be the responsibility of JC staff to collect the deductible from the judicial officer. Based upon the disproportionate impact and collection requirements, LSO recommended against a deductible.
- Only one carrier provides this type of insurance for judges. LSO is not aware of any carrier that offers this type of insurance individually. LSO does not believe judges could purchase this insurance on the open market at an affordable cost.

LSO has performed due diligence on whether or not costs can be reduced from this program. The program is cost effective and beneficial to all judicial officers. Recommend no change or reduction to this program.

Litigation Management Program (\$4,000,000 - reduced from \$4,500,000, effective FY 15-16)

The Litigation Management Program was approved by the Judicial Council in 1999 to ensure adequate funding to respond to litigation arising out of trial court operations. The fund was established in the

amount of \$4.5 million from the Trial Court Improvement Fund. The allocation for the Litigation Management Program is used to pay settlements, judgments (if any), and litigation costs, including outside counsel fees, arising from claims and lawsuits brought against trial courts. In addition, at court request, the program provides counsel to assist courts with responses to subpoenas and to assist judges with answers to disqualification statements. Government Code section 811.9 requires the Judicial Council to provide for the representation, defense, and indemnification of the state's trial courts, trial court judicial officers, and court employees.

Review of Program

LSO has managed to keep the cost of the program below \$4 million on an annual basis. This year, LSO estimates cost to be at or close to \$4 million. LSO currently works with the AG's Office on certain matters, handles matters internally and contracts with private counsel. LSO is in the process of issuing an RFI in an effort to confirm the most competitive rates and to expand law firms in various parts of the state. LSO receives more claims than when the program was implemented based upon transfer of facilities.

Based upon the statutory nature of the program, we recommend no change to the Litigation Management Program. From a policy perspective, the JC's Litigation and Management Committee may wish to establish further parameters of the program based upon the growing need of the program and the inability for the IMF to absorb additional costs.

Trial Court Transactional Assistance Program (\$451,000 – reduced from \$685,000, effective FY 12-13)

The Trial Court Transactional Assistance Program began in July 2001 as a means by which the Legal Services Office could provide transactional legal assistance to the trial courts through outside counsel selected and managed by the LSO. The program later expanded and the allocation is now used almost exclusively to pay for outside counsel managed by the Legal Services office to represent the trial courts in labor arbitrations and proceedings before the Public Employment Relations Board (PERB). To a lesser extent, the funds are used to pay for outside counsel to assist trial courts with legal services in specialized areas of court operations, e.g., tax and employee benefits.

Review of Program

All cost for the program are paid to outside counsel representing trial courts primarily in labor arbitrations and PERB matters. The fund does not have sufficient funds this fiscal year to cover all requests. The fund covers the cost of defense, but does not provide the cost of indemnification (e.g., if an arbitrator awards back pay, the pay comes from the local court's budget). Approximately 30% of the fund is for representation of courts in arbitrations challenging termination actions and approximately 30% percent is for representation in PERB matters. The remainder of the fund is for labor arbitration for language interpretation or disciplinary actions less than termination. There is no statutory requirement for operation of the program.

Recommendations:

- Savings from the Regional Office Assistant Group be transferred to fully fund this program through this fiscal year. If not adopted, courts need to be notified effective March 1, the fund cannot absorb additional claims for this fiscal year.
- Support the ongoing efforts of LSO and the Litigation Management Committee to refine program parameters so that the program meets IMF funding restrictions.
 - o LSO recommends representation for PERB matters based upon statewide implication and representation for arbitrations challenging termination actions based upon the gravity of the arbitration. We are in agreement with LSO's recommendation that these two case types be funded. All other arbitration defense cost will be the responsibility of the local court. LSO estimates \$350,000 will be needed to cover these two case types, with a cost savings of \$101,000 to the IMF.
- If funding for Phoenix allows for no reductions to LSO programs, recommend savings from Regional Office Assistance Group be shifted to this program this fiscal year and next fiscal year with no reduction in services based on case type.

Regional Office Assistance Group (\$1,460,000)

The allocation is used for four attorneys, one analyst, and one administrative specialist working in Burbank and Sacramento. The Regional Office Assistance Group serves as liaisons, consultants, advocates, and direct legal services providers to the trial courts in the areas of transactions/business operations, legal opinions, and labor and employment law.

Review of Program

LSO anticipates approximately \$200,000 savings in this program this fiscal year. We recommend a portion of this savings be transferred to the Trial Court Transactional Assistance Program while parameters are established for that program by the Litigation Management Committee. Commencing with FY 16/17, the program be funded at \$1,260,000, with a savings of \$200,000.

• The Judicial Council consultant is currently examining what, if any, services should be structured on a fee service model to the courts. This program is part of that study. JC staff requested this program not be separated out from the overall study. We agree with that recommendation.

Litigation Management Program – no change (\$4,000,000)

Trial Court Transactional Assistance Program – modify program for cost savings (\$451,000 to \$350,000 in 16/17)

Regional Office Assistance Group – transfer cost savings to Transactional Assistance Program this fiscal year. Reduce program by \$200,000 in 16/17 (\$1,460,000 to \$1,260,000).

Addressing the Budget Shortfall

- Working from a needs-based approach, our estimated need for FY 16-17 was approximately \$35M
- CALNET 3 introduced new service-based options, which give us the ability to migrate to a managed firewall solution that reduces the estimated FY 16-17 need to approximately \$28.8M
- A lease/finance approach was proposed to address the remaining shortfall.





- Conclusion: Finance
 - Briefing provided by the California Department of General Services (DGS) that reviewed both options.
 - DGS can arrange either option, but their advice is that a lease generally costs more.
- Considerations
 - This would be a secured loan. The equipment being purchased serves as the collateral
 - We need to be cognizant of unencumbered obligations.
 - Payment issues impact the state's bond rating





Finance Process

- Facilitated by the Department of General Service's GS \$mart program
- No fees from DGS. We pay only interest and bond counsel.
- DGS screens lenders to determine which will provide the best deal.
- We need to adhere to the established purchase schedule. Courts will lose the flexibility to defer implementations.





One-time, Periodic or Ongoing?

- Conclusion: Periodic
- Basis:
 - Provides the flattest budget with the least amount of finance charges.
 - We still anticipate fluctuations from year to year, even with efforts to shift expenses out of peak years.
 - Financing provides no benefit in off-peak years





- Three scenarios were modeled in this review:
 - Scenario 1: assumes full funding of program obligations
 - Scenario 2: assumes reduced funding based on current budget limitations, and addresses the shortfall through the deferral of hardware replacement
 - Scenario 3: assumes reduced funding based on current budget limitations, and addresses the shortfall through financing.

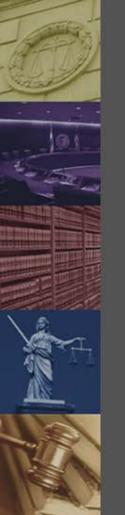

Conclusion

- Scenario 3 provides the most effective balance between the need to level the budget, while keeping the finance charges at a reasonable level.
 - Resolves the funding shortfall that is inherent with option 1
 - Avoids the need to defer hardware replacement
 - Least risk of impact to the court's daily operations
