#### transitive verb

1 : to ascertain the heaviness of by or as if by a balance

2 a: OUTWEIGH

**b**: COUNTERBALANCE

c : to make heavy : WEIGHT → often used with down

**STUDY** implies sustained purposeful concentration and attention to details and minutiae. *study* the plan closely

**CONTEMPLATE** stresses focusing one's thoughts on something but does not imply coming to a conclusion or decision.

contemplate the consequences of refusing

**WEIGH** implies attempting to reach the truth or arrive at a decision by balancing conflicting claims or evidence. *weigh* the pros and cons of the case


